

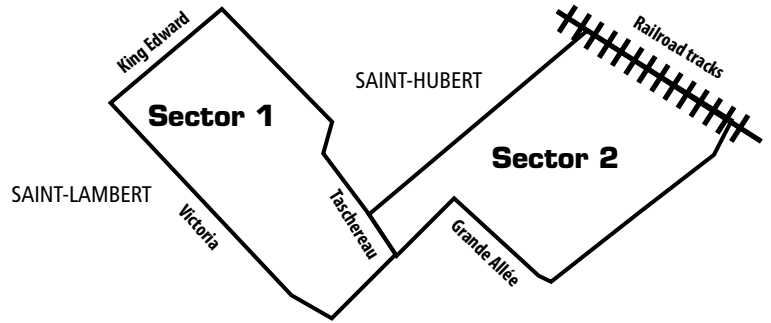

The collections scheduled for January 1 and December 25, 2019, will take place the following day. The collections scheduled for other holidays will proceed as planned.

MAKING SURE COLLECTIONS RUN SMOOTHLY!

- To prevent them from breaking, bins must not weigh more than 80 kg (175 lb.).
- Do not place your bin on the street, sidewalk, or bicycle path.



Place your bin at the curb, **between 8 p.m. the night before and 7 .m. on the morning** of the collection.

To report a broken bin or a missed collection, call **311** to speak to the Citizen Service Centre.

1 WASTE

- Non-recyclable waste can be placed beside the bin

Refused materials

Construction debris, chlorine and propane

2 RECYCLABLE MATERIALS

Paper and cardboard

- Cardboard boxes must be broken down and bundled (max. 60 cm x 60 cm), and placed next to your bin.
- Newspapers, circulars, and magazines
- Paper bags, wrapping paper
- Corrugated and regular cardboard
- Telephone directories
- Milk and juice cartons



Refused materials

Soiled or greasy paper or cardboard, wax paper, carbon paper, toilet paper, paper towels, tissues, stickers, wallpaper, foil wrappers (e.g., granola bars), padded envelopes, diapers.

Glass containers

- Bottles, vials and jars of all shapes and colours (with or without label)



Refused materials

Mirrors and windows (broken or not), dishes, porcelain and pottery, crystal, Pyrex, incandescent light bulbs, fluorescent tubes.

Plastic containers

- Shampoo and laundry soap bottles, food trays and soft drink bottles, including lids and plastic caps
- Clean plastic grocery, produce and shopping bags, dry cleaning bags



Refused materials

No. 6 plastics, Styrofoam, paint cans, motor oil bottles, toothpaste tubes, rubber items, items made up of several different materials (toys, tools, etc.), Christmas decorations, pool accessories.

Metal containers

- Aluminium cans
- Caps and lids
- Aluminium foil, trays and cans



Refused materials

Batteries, paint, stripper or aerosol cans

3 BRANCHES

- Tie branches into bundles of less than 30 cm in diameter and 1 m long.



- Branches must be less than 5 cm in diameter.
- Branches thicker than 5 cm in diameter must be dropped off at an ecocentre.

4 GREEN WASTE (leaves and plants)

- Place in **PAPER BAGS**, which will also be composted.
- Clear or orange plastic bags are accepted.

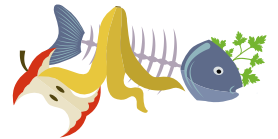

5 ORGANIC MATERIALS

For citizens not yet served by the organic waste collection, **9 voluntary sites** are available throughout the city's territory.

6 ECOCENTRES

- Construction debris: wood, drywall, bricks, shingles
- Electronic devices: TVs, printers, computers, etc.
- Earth
- Metal items
- Bulky items
- Household hazardous waste (HHW): oil, batteries, paint, varnish, solvents, pesticides, chlorine, aerosols, antifreeze, propane tanks, etc.

7 BULKY ITEMS

- At the ecocentres (wood, plastic or metal)
- During waste collections (upholstered furniture, mattress in a bag, 1 m from the bin)
